From here, continue your journey to the exquisite Banteay Srei Temple, known as the “Citadel of Women” for its delicate and intricate carvings in soft pink sandstone. This temple is a highlight for art and history lovers, with richly detailed bas-reliefs depicting Hindu mythology and Khmer legends. Surrounded by lush greenery, the site’s smaller scale and fine craftsmanship offer a unique contrast to the grand temples of Angkor.

After immersing yourself in temple history, shift gears toward a hands-on cultural experience at Preah Dak Village, a charming rural community known for its living traditions and welcoming spirit. Upon arrival, hop onto a traditional ox-cart and enjoy a peaceful ride through the village’s scenic paths, bordered by rice paddies, sugar palm trees, and wooden stilt houses. This simple mode of travel gives you a closer look at local village life.

Next, join a local family where you’ll learn to make Nom Banh Chok, Cambodia’s traditional rice noodle dish. Participate in the full process—from grinding soaked rice to forming the noodles by hand—and enjoy your fresh-made noodles served with flavorful herbs and sauce. It’s a tasty and authentic way to connect with Khmer culinary culture.
